## Validity of Baptisms from other Faiths

\*\*\*NOTE: In the case of Eastern Christians who seek full communion, no liturgical rite is required. RCIA, #474 states: "In the case of eastern Christians who enter into the fullness of Catholic communion, no liturgical rite is required, but simply a profession of Catholic faith, even if such persons are permitted, in virtue of recourse to the Apostolic See, to transfer to the Latin rite." As stated above, those Eastern Christians are to be accepted into full communion into the *corresponding rite* in the Catholic Church. They may not transfer to the Latin rite without permission

\*\*\*NOTE: The following list is alphabetical, NOT all-inclusive, and NOT an official list of the USCCB. It is only a guide to help determine the validity of baptism.
